Chapter One

The Importance of the Rapture

And there you watch a special worldwide global news report declaring that millions of people all over the planet are missing, not just your family, but literally millions of people. And as this slowly begins to sink in, you look down and spy your loved ones Bible sitting right there on the coffee table and suddenly it dawns on you that your Christian family was right after all when they kept telling you over and over again about this Rapture thing. And so to your horror, you realize, oh no, **you have been left behind** and you will now be catapulted into the 7-year Tribulation that’s coming upon the whole world.” Pastor Billy Crone, *The Rapture Don’t Be Deceived*.

3. What two passages of Scripture by the Apostle Paul describe in detail the Rapture event?
4. Does Jesus refer to the Rapture, and if so, where in Scripture is it found?
5. When comparing Paul’s Rapture passages to Jesus’ mention of the Rapture, are they in complete agreement?

a. What conclusion can you make of this?

Chapter Three

The Purpose of the Rapture

“Which brings us to the **third thing** we’re going to look to avoid being deceived about the Rapture and that is **What is the Purpose of the Rapture?** Why is it that Paul, Jesus and the Bible in general talk about this event? Why bring it up? What’s the purpose of it in the first place?” Pastor Billy Crone, *The Rapture Don’t Be Deceived*.

Chapter Five

The Unknown Hour

“The **second evidence** the Rapture takes place PRIOR to the 7-year Tribulation is in **The Unknown Hour**. As we’ve already seen, the Pre-Trib Rapture is imminent, it can happen at any time, there’s no prophetic event that needs to occur before it can take place. We also saw Paul comforting and reassuring the Thessalonica Church to not worry about being in the 7-year Tribulation or missing the Rapture because it occurs BEFORE the “Day of the Lord” which occurs DURING the 7-year Tribulation.” Pastor Billy Crone, *The Rapture Don’t Be Deceived*.

Study

2. There are many signs that precede the Second Coming—can you name some of them?
3. Can you name any signs to watch for preceding the Rapture?
4. Pastor Billy explains that the approximate time of the Second Coming of Christ can be calculated once the beginning or mid-point of the 7-year Tribulation is known—what reason is given for the Rapture to remain an uncalculated event?

5. Why does Pastor Billy say that the Rapture “HAS to occur BEFORE the 7-year Tribulation and its seven years’ worth of signs to calculate the event”?

4. Matthew 24:31 and Matthew 24:40-41 are often cited as proof of the Rapture of the church—can you explain why this is not so?

5. Who are the “elect” of Matthew 24:31?

Chapter Seven

The Location of the Church

“Many people who disagree with the Pre-tribulation Rapture of the Church say in regards to the location of the Church, ‘Well, that’s easy to answer. The location of the Church is IN the 7-year Tribulation,’ and for supposed proof they cite the word ‘saint’ and attribute it to the ‘Church.’ Now the word ‘saint’ does appear during the events mentioned in the Book of Revelation concerning the 7-year Tribulation, however, a quick look at the facts reveals that it cannot be referring to the Church.” Pastor Billy Crone, *The Rapture Don’t Be Deceived*.

Study

1. In the context of the 7-year Tribulation described in Revelation chapter 3 through 18, who are the “saints” and how do you know?

2. Describe what will happen to most of the people that get saved during the 7-year Tribulation.



3. What is the significance of the phrase “come up here” of Revelation 4:1 in light of the same phrase used of the two witnesses of Revelation 11:12?

4. In light of the phrases “come up here” and “a door standing open in heaven” of Revelation 4:1, together with “heaven standing open” of Revelation 19:11, 14, where can we surmise the church to have been during the 7-year Tribulation?

5. What can be said about the identity of the “24 Elders” of Revelation 4:4, 10, 11 in respect to their white linen clothing, golden crowns, and sitting on thrones?

6. Since crowns are rewards for faithfulness, why could the “24 Elders” not be Old Testament believers? (Hint: Daniel 12:1-2)

7. Of what significance does the title “Elders” have in determining the identity of the these “Elders”?

8. Many have tried to identify the “Elders” as angels. Using Revelation 5:11, describe how this is not possible.

9. Describe how Revelation 5:9 identifies the “Elders” as the church.

10. Pastor Billy points out a difference between the white robes worn by raptured church saints and the martyred saints of the Tribulation. What is that difference?

- a. Does it simply mean that the church will be “preserved” rather than “removed from”?
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- 5. Who are the martyrs described in Revelation 7:9, 13-15?
 - a. How can they be the church, if as non-pre-Tribulationists postulate if they have not been “preserved” rather than removed from the hour of trial?
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- 6. Explain how the “7-year Tribulation” differs from “general tribulation” experienced by all believers.
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- 7. How can it be said that ALL 19 judgments, including the Seal Judgments, mentioned in Revelation chapter 6-18 are God’s wrath?

3. How is the Holy Spirit working today to restrain evil?

4. Explain how 2 Thessalonians 2:1-3 and Daniel 9:27 support a pre-Tribulation Rapture.
 - a. Explain who are the ones that will go through the 7-year Tribulation in regards to Daniel 9:27.

 - b. Does Daniel 9:27 support the church being in the 7-year Tribulation? Explain.

5. Give examples of how God spared some people from a time of His judgments.



4. Where in Scripture did Jesus refer to this prophecy of the 7-year Tribulation?
 - a. Why can we say that this prophecy is yet for a future time?

5. What is the significance of a “gap” between Daniel’s 69th and 70th weeks found in Daniel 9:24-27?

6. What is the significance of Jeremiah 30:4-7 when Jeremiah states that the Tribulation will be like no other day and says that “it will be a time of trouble for Jacob, but he will be saved out of it”?
 - a. Who is “Jacob” and does this prophecy have anything to do with the church?

7. Ezekiel 20:30, 34, and 38 speaks of a future gathering and purging of Israel from among the nations. For what purpose is the gathering and purging? Explain.

8. According to Daniel 12:1, who are the “people” that are in great distress and are delivered?

a. In light of this, what is the significance of Revelation 12:1-9?

b. Who is the “woman” that is protected in Revelation 12?

9. According to Pastor Billy, “all these passages” concerning the 7-year Tribulation are speaking about who?

a. What significance does this have for the church?

13. So, according to Pastor Billy, what is the “primary purpose” of the Tribulation Period?

a. Who are the “multitudes” that are also saved?

“The **fifth thing** we’re going to look to avoid being deceived and that is **What about the Objections of the Pre-Trib Rapture?** Believe it or not, even with the massive amount of Biblical evidence we’ve already seen that clearly supports a Pretribulational Rapture of the Church, some will still object to this teaching and instead throw up various accusations against it.” Pastor Billy Crone, *The Rapture Don’t Be Deceived*.

15. What kind of bodies do those who come to believe during the Tribulation enter the Millennial Kingdom with?

16. What is the “Bema Judgment” and what is its purpose for the church?

a. What are the rewards depicted by in the Scripture and what is their purpose for the Christian—can you name some of the rewards?

b. Why does Pastor Billy say that the “Bema Judgment” shows that the Post-Trib Rapture cannot be true?

17. Explain the “first resurrection” mentioned in Revelation 20:4-6 and who are included?

a. Why is it called the “first resurrection” and is it a single event?

18. What is the “second death”?

19. In 2 Th 2:7-8 what is the order of events in relation to Rapture and the revealing of the Antichrist?

20. In 2 Th 2:7-8 who is “the one who now holds back” and what is the implication of “the one who now holds back” being “taken out of the way” in relation to the Rapture?

b. Which Rapture position supports the Doctrine of Imminency?

28. If knowledge of the Rapture is to be comforting (1 Th 4:15-18) to believers, what does this say about each of the Rapture positions? Pre-Trib? Post-Trib? Mid-Trib? Pre-Wrath?

Chapter Fifteen

The Problems with Pre-Wrath



“The **second position** on the Rapture that has some serious problems with it is **The Pre-Wrath Position**. Or should I say more accurately, the Three-Quarters Rapture Position. The title is a little deceptive because it doesn’t tell you the timing of when they think the Rapture will take place.” Pastor Billy Crone, *The Rapture Don’t Be Deceived*.

2. What does Pastor Billy say is the “basic core difference” between the Pre-Wrath and Pre-Trib Rapture positions?

- a. How would you describe the Pre-Wrath position in one word?
 - b. Do you believe God would make something as important as the Rapture confusing?
3. How can it be said that the Seal Judgments are included in what is known as the Wrath of God?
- a. When does the 7-year Tribulation begin in relation to the Seal Judgments?
 - b. Who releases the Seal Judgments, God, man, or Satan, and what does that say about whose Wrath they represent?
4. In Revelation 12:12 Satan is filled with fury (Satan's wrath). What is Satan's wrath in reaction to?

- a. According to the Pre-Wrath teaching, what series of judgments are considered God's wrath?
 - b. According to the Pre-Trib teaching, what series of judgments are considered God's wrath?
5. We have seen that Jesus (God) releases the Seal Judgments. Under whose authority do the angels release the Trumpet Judgments?
6. What does Revelation 15:1 state in regards to the Bowl Judgments that implies that the preceding judgments were also the wrath of God?
7. Discuss how Revelation 6:16-17 shows that all of the Seal Judgments are the wrath of God.
 - a. If the church is not to experience the wrath of God as Scripture says, then what does this say about the timing of the Rapture?

16. In Daniel 9:20-27 who is being addressed, the church or Israel?

a. Since Daniel 9:27 is the basis for the 7-year Tribulation, what does this imply is the purpose for the Tribulation?

b. Can it be said that the church has any part in the prophecy of Daniel's 70-weeks (Dan 9:24-27)?

17. Historically, when the 69th week of Daniel ended, it ended abruptly (Dan 9:24-26) and the church began abruptly. What might we expect of the church just before the beginning of Daniel's 70th week (Dan 9:27)?

18. Who are the "Tribulation Saints"?

a. What do they have to do with the church? Explain.

- b. Why is it better to get saved now?
19. If the martyred great multitude of Revelation 7:9 represent the raptured church as the Pre-Wrath view supposes, then where are those that simply died in Christ?
- a. What can be said of the Pre-Wrath contention that while the martyred group is in heaven another group is waiting on earth for the Rapture in light of 1 Th 4:17?
20. Discuss why Matthew chapter 24 is not dealing with the church, but rather with Israel and the Jewish people.
21. Explain what event Matthew 24:29-31 refers to and why.

22. In 2 Th 2:7-8 “the one who now holds back” (the restrainer) is taken “out” of the way before the Antichrist is revealed. Explain who this “restrainer” is and what has this to do with the timing of the Rapture.

23. Why does Marvin Rosenthal insist that the “restrainer” is the angel Michael?

24. How does the Pre-Wrath Rapture destroy the purpose and encouraging hope (1 Th 4:18; 1 Th 5:11) of the promise of the Rapture?

25. If the Rapture of the church is an imminent event, then what should our focus be as a Christian?

a. What is the hope of those that subscribe to the Pre-Wrath view?

b. What are those that believe the Pre-Wrath view looking for?

26. If, as the Pre-Wrath view believes, the end-time church will experience cleansing and purging during the Tribulation—what does that say about Christ’s sacrifice on the cross for our sins?

a. Explain why this idea is similar to the Catholic Doctrine of Purgatory.

4. What can be said of the statement of Revelation 6:17 “For the great day of his wrath is come; and who shall be able to stand” in relation to the previously released Seal Judgments?
 - a. How does this negate the Mid-Trib Rapture?

5. In the Trumpet Judgments, who directs the angels?
 - a. How can it be said that the Trumpet Judgments are a continuation of the wrath of God that began with the Seal Judgments?

6. What does the Mid-Trib Rapture view say in regards to the ending of the church age in relation to the 7-year Tribulation?

- a. Does the 7th Trumpet of Revelation have anything to do with the Rapture? Explain.



9. Explain how the Mid-Trib Rapture destroys imminency.

- a. How is the church to live in light of imminency?

10. Regarding the Pre-Trib Rapture, are there any signs to look for before the Rapture?

- a. How then should we respond in our life and witness?
